he Planetary Coral Reef Foundation (PCRF) and Raffles Marina (RM) have collaborated for almost a decade, on coral reef conservation in the Aseanarean Sea. This partnership has included joint participation in the 1999 Marine Parks of Indonesia Expedition, an exchange of scientific information regarding the reefs studied in Southeast Asia (www.pcrf.org/ science/index.html), and the design of Wastewater Gardens®, a sustainable wastewater recycling system, for floating fish farms.

The MOU signed by Francis Lee (President of RM) and Abigail Alling (President of PCRF), in October 2006, heralded the beginning of new adventures and a renewed commitment to the conservation of coral reefs in the Aseanarean and Melanesia regions. The mutual decision to make RM our home



port, and us, your "Club At Sea", signifies our long-term commitment to this initiative. Our first project that month, swiftly organised by Francis was a meeting between PCRF and Dr Aji and his team from Indonesia's Ministry of Marine Affairs and Fisheries, in the Anambas Islands, to study coral reefs!

In support of our offshore work, PCRF also newly acquired a 120' two-masted sailing vessel named *Infinity*. In October last year, we sailed *Infinity* from Phuket to ready her in Singapore, for the upcoming two-year expedition. Upon our arrival to a bustling Raffles Marina, we were placed alongside our old friend and PCRF Asia Representative, Yves de Leeneer, on board his vessel *l'Attitude*. Moreover, the year-end celebrations of Hari Raya and Deepavali saw us showered with donations and blessings.
